Course Number EGL-406-01 **Course Description** In this seminar, we will read and write creative nonfiction, a broad category that includesmemoir and personal essay, literary journalism, travel writing, micro-essays (or flash nonfiction). Our focus will be particularly on lyric essays, a contemporary form that draws from and combines poetry, memoir, research writing, and the personal essay and plays inventively with fragments, juxtaposition, and association to artfully build narrative and argument.
